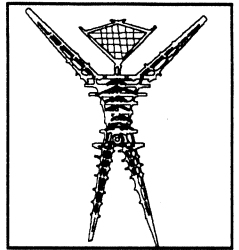

## Playa Factoids

The word "playa" means beach in Spanish, but its English definition derives from an alternate use of the term: "a tract of hard clayey land which frequently becomes covered with water during heavy rains, and finally becomes dry again; a dried-up lake basin."

- 60,000 years ago this was the bottom of a lake — Lake Lahontan. The silt that now makes up the Playa's surface lies nearly two miles deep in some spots.

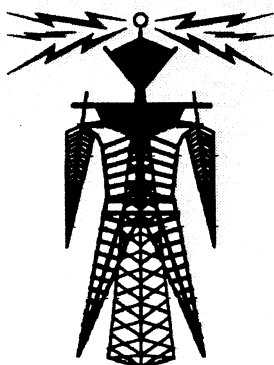
- An estimated 50 percent of all gold-seeking immigrants in 1849 crossed the Playa on the Applegate trail.

- During the 1940s and 50s, the desert was used as a bombing range. Unexploded shells and live ammunition can still occasionally be found. Stay clear! They can still explode.

- In 1983, a British racing team set a world land speed record on the playa: 633.468 miles per hour.

- If you've ever seen the movie *Buckaroo Banzai Across the Eighth Dimension*, you may recognize the playa as the site where Buckaroo first achieved crossover in the jet car.

## You Are Here

Out here in the desert, one of the last places on earth where eccentricity is still prized as a virtue, the locals have learned that tolerance is the key to successful coexistence — indeed, to survival. ## Travel Tips for Playa Explorers

- ✓ Always let your neighbors in camp know where you're going and how long you plan to be gone.

- ✓ Avoid the outer edges of the Playa, particularly the southernmost patch near Gerlach and the area southeast of Black Rock. These regions, though they may look dry, are impassable most of the year.

- ✓ There are abandoned mine shafts throughout the surrounding hills. Stay clear unless you have a hopeless fascination with loose rock, rotten timbers, bad air and rattlesnakes.

- ✓ When you leave the Playa, watch out for animals, especially at night. The entire area is open rangeland and there may be livestock or wild horses on the roads.

- ✓ Be advised that many of the nearby "towns" listed on the map are in fact deserted ghost towns. Hardin City, Trego, Sulfur and Leadville are all uninhabited. Ranches listed on some maps are inhabited only part of the year.

- ✓ Any time you drive out of camp, carry survival gear and supplies for at least 24 hours, including highway flares, jack, spare

tire, compass, water and blankets. Consult your registration packet or a Black Rock Ranger for details.

- ✓ If private land is posted, respect the signs. Private ranches can usually be identified by the clusters of buildings, fenced pastures, and, if you come too close unannounced, the muzzle flash of shotguns.

- ✓ The BLM advises that the most dangerous roads in the area are the graded, graveled, all-weather roads. People tend to travel much faster than the 45-mph limit.

- ✓ The road through High Rock Canyon is an axle-buster. Locals suggest you avoid it, even in a high-clearance 4-wheel drive.

- ✓ If you get stuck or break down, your best bet is probably to stick with your vehicle. Black Rock Rangers will be monitoring CB Channel 23. At night, use a highway flare to signal for help. If you feel you must leave your vehicle, leave a note saying when you left and which way you went. Avoid walking in peak sun hours (Noon - 4pm). Keep in mind that any food you eat will require extra water to digest, and that you can go for weeks without food but only a day or two without water.

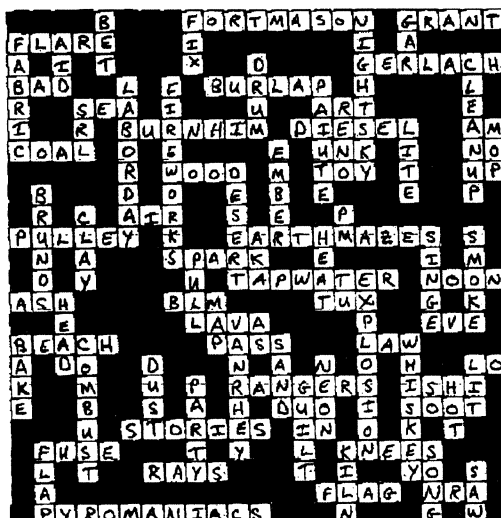

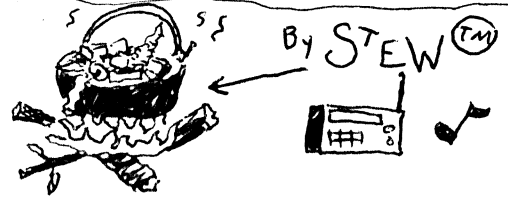

## RADIO WARS HEAT UP



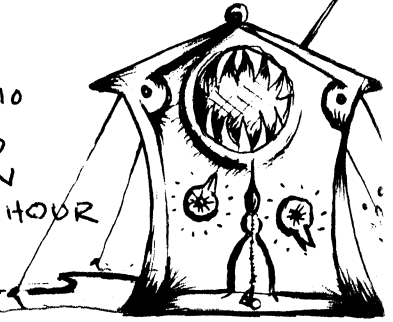

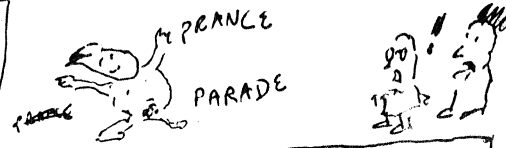

# 4 Directions



Four directions is performed by four loudspeakers which are placed at the points of the compass around, and pointing towards the Burning Man. Each speaker plays a series of long tones in a specific vocal range. The speaker to the north plays tones in a low male voice range, the speaker to the east plays tones in a high female range, south is high male, west is low male. The audience/participants tend to act in some combination of three ways: 1. They find a place where the sound mixes well and sit there and listens. 2. They wander around, changing the mix as they move. 3. They find a speaker in their vocal range and sing along with the tones.

The piece is roughly 19 minutes long and will be performed at dawn ending at first light on Saturday + Sunday. There will be ~~altars~~ altars with space for participants to add personal objects in front of each speaker. All objects will be burned with the ~~Burning~~ Man, so participants should only put burnable, disposable objects on the altars.

## DOZENS FAIL TO DIE - LACK OF CARNAGE STUNS BM CAMP

After Day 2 of Burning

Man, no participants have been blown up, poisoned, immolated, or murdered for snoring. However, several injuries have been reported. At approx. 3pm yesterday, a participant was hurt by a fall off the trampoline at Bordello Springs. He was evacuated to Reno with back injuries by helicopter. 2 traffic accidents were reported; a participant injured when his mountain bike hit a car. Another collision resulted in an accident victim being taken to Reno with 2 broken legs. Non human casualties include: two dogs, one scalded non-fatally by a hot spring, one with a broken jaw because of a fight. Also, I got the kickups yesterday.

Danger Ranger reports attempted piracy on the playa; the participant sped away before being robbed. However, caution should be used on the playa, especially when alone.

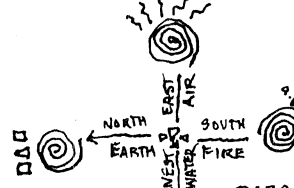

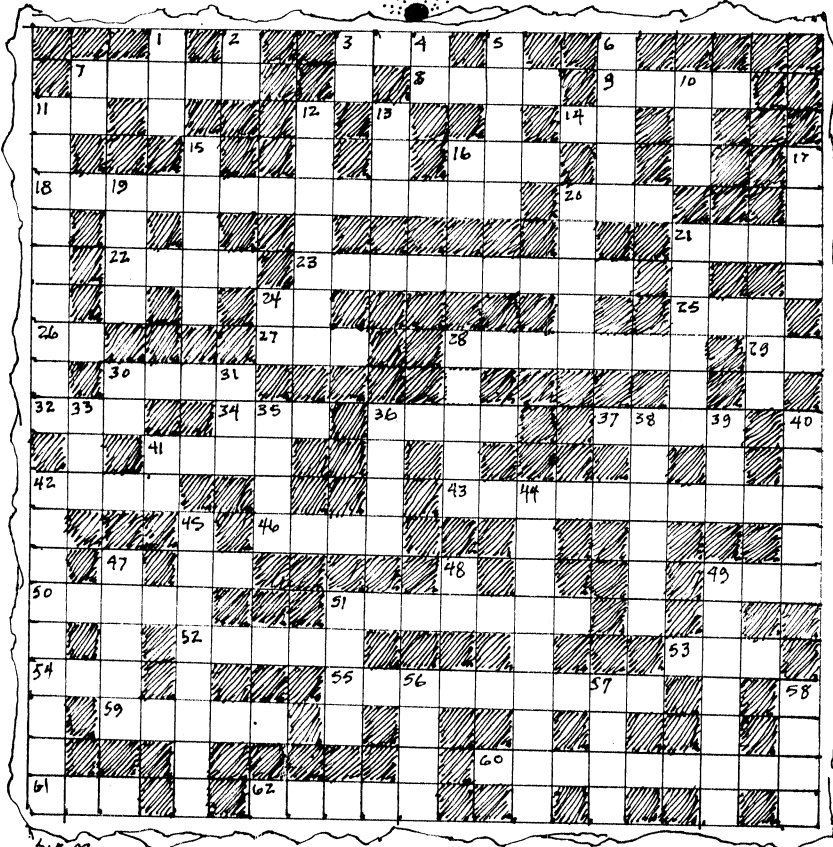

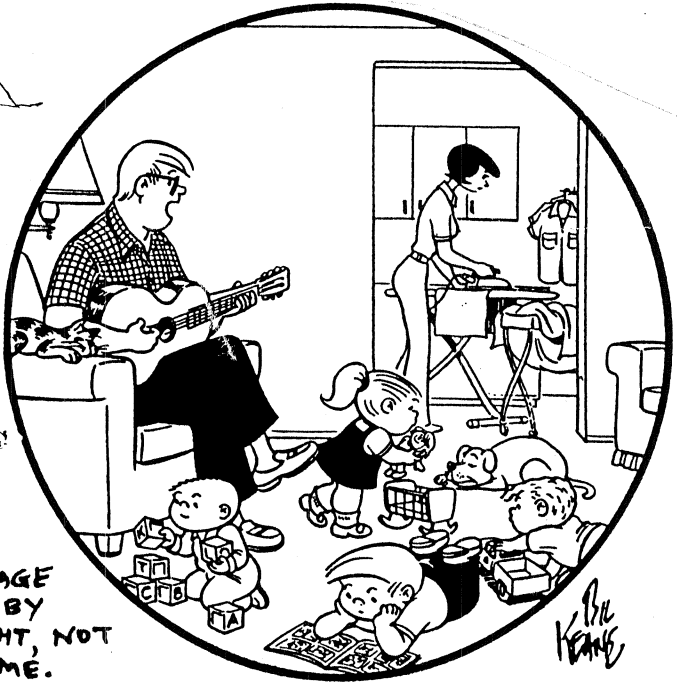
